ARTIST GUEST OF HONOR



JOE JUSKO

Joe Jusko is undoubtedly one of the best known fantasy, pinup, and comic artists in the world today. His career has spanned over 30 years, starting with the sale of his very first cover for Heavy Metal Magazine in 1977 at the age of 17. Since graduating that year from NYC's High School of Art & Design, Joe has worked for almost every major comic book publisher, producing hundreds of images for both covers and interiors. His work has appeared on paperback book covers, calendars, posters, t-shirts, toy packaging, and innumerable trading cards, most memorably the multi-award winning 1992 Marvel Masterpieces Trading Cards. The popularity of that set has been credited with initiating the painted trading card boom of the 1990s, and led to his groundbreaking 1995 Art of Edgar Rice Burroughs trading cards. Those 125 paintings have made him the most prolific Burroughs artist ever, producing art based on almost every major book by the famed author.




JEFF MIRACOLA

Steve won "Best-in-Show" at the 2007 GenCon, published a book of drawings in 2009 (AGGREGATE) and another in 2016 (Steve Prescott's Alphabet Book of Mythological Beings), has had work in multiple Spectrum: The Best in Contemporary Fantastic Art annuals, did all the illustration for the app game SoulSpark, has done concept work for D&D, Magic: the Gathering, Hasbro, Bethesda, Valve, and even worked on pre-production creature designs for the My Little Pony movie (Yes, you read that right.).

Monday, June 10th, 8am

Check in just inside MIAD's main entrance at 273 E Erie St, Milwaukee. Art Room Setup

Monday, June 10th, 8am

After you've checked in, please head up to the art rooms on the third floor to set up your workspace. If you don't finish your setup before our mandatory opening address at 9am, don't worry. You can finish up afterward.

There are no assigned workspaces. However, Art Room 390 is reserved for oil painters as that room has a special ventilation system to expel fumes. Attendees working in a medium other than oil paint may set up in either mixed media room (Art rooms 395 or 399) or in the oil painting room if space allows, as priority is given to oil painters.

Digital artists, we will provide power strips and extension cords. You should bring all your necessary cables. We will lock the rooms at night. You may choose to leave your desktop computers overnight, but we suggest you take your smaller devices back to your hotel room each night for safekeeping.



Art Rooms

Art rooms are located on the third floor. We will use Rooms 390 (for oil painters), 395 (mixed media), 399 (mixed media), and 399A (multi-purpose). The rooms are opened each day at 8am and locked each night at 9pm.

Art Room Safety

A safe work environment is a happy work environment. Please keep your work area as clean as possible. Paint or paint water should never be discarded in sinks. Please use paper towels to remove as much paint from your paint can or palette before rinsing. At no time should any solvents or mediums be poured down sinks. Please discard used solvents and mediums in provided containers. Oily rags or paper towels with oil paint on them must be discarded in provided metal containers, not the regular trash bin. Rags or paper towels used to clean water-based paints can be discarded in regular trash bins. When not using paints, solvents, and mediums, please keep their lids closed to prevent spillage.

Portfolio Reviews

We'll have a sign-up sheet available on Day One. Please make sure to be ready five minutes before your scheduled time so the art director or faculty member is not waiting on you. Likewise, please do not go over your allotted time with an art director unless s/he chooses to extend the time. At all times, be courteous and respectful to our art director guests.
